



How Did Pride Start?

In 1969, police raided a gay bar in New York City called the Stonewall Inn. Back then, IGBTQ+ people weren't allowed to gather or be themselves openly.

But that night, people fought back. They were tired of being treated unfairlu.

This event, called the Stonewall Uprising, helped start the modern GBTQ+ rights movement.

One year after Stonewall, in 1970,

people marched in the streets to demand equal rights.

That was the first Pride parade - and it's been happenina every June since!
